







### **Editorial by Mick Ridley and James Read**

### **Dear Editors**

I would like to let our residents know of the following.

Myself, Cllr Morgan, Ward Councillors Brown and Liddiard have all been working behind the scenes in order to obtain grants to enable the money to be available for road safety measures to be put in place.

A village walk-about took place where Cllr's Morgan, Brown and Liddiard in conjunction with an officer of Central Beds Council (CBC) Traffic Department walked the length of the village to see and understand the issues highlighted in the traffic petition forwarded to CBC. The CBC officer is currently preparing a report which will highlight the areas most in need of improvements to road safety. In addition she has been asked to provide an estimate of costs involved in order that we include these in any grant application.

The Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) has offered a grant scheme for improving road safety in Bedfordshire and I on behalf of the Parish Council have applied for such a grant.

In addition CBC have a Rural Matched Funding Scheme; as a Parish Council we can apply for this. It could provide funds for the road safety improvements. It is hoped by the time the next issue of the Messenger is published we will have positive news about our grant applications.







### **Parish Council**

A Statutory Meeting of Meppershall Parish Council (MPC) took place on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> May.

**Election of Chairman and Vice-Chairman -** At the meeting, Councillor John Thompson was elected Chairman and Councillor John Parsons was elected as Vice-Chairman.

**Public Session** - CBC Ward Councillor Mark Liddiard provided an update on Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) activities as follows:

- A walk of the village road was carried out by CBC Principal Highways Officer Lisa Wright, Cllr Liddiard and MPC Cllr Morgan. Subsequent to the visit a specific 'master plan' for Shefford Road is to be created to ensure that potential traffic calming measures are installed in the correct locations (the use of traffic islands is being considered). Issues raised concerning traffic outside the Post Office / Village Stores will be harder to tackle. Bollards outside the Village Stores are probably not viable however a double raised kerb may be and investigations into this are ongoing. It is suggested that speeding issues on Fildyke Road are monitored but there is little support for increasing parking restrictions there.
- Road improvements come at a cost. Ms Wright will look into CBC funding options. The Shillington Road vehicle activated sign is to be replaced by the developer of 15 Shillington Road. The 2 x raised tables on Shefford Road will be installed by the developer of 32 Shefford Road (Bovis). MPC has submitted an OPCC Grant Application and will look to take advantage of match funding available from the Rural Match Fund when it becomes available and once CBC agreed projects are costed.
- CBC has advertised additional business support grants that are also now available to public houses.
- A meeting was held with MPC Cllr Morgan regarding a rat issue on Fildyke Road.
- The 40 Shefford Road planning appeal was dismissed by the Planning Inspector on the grounds of harm to the landscape.

**Questions / comments from the public -** Thanks were offered to members of MPC, Ward Councillors, CPRE and Meppershall residents who has all contributed to the 40 Shefford Road appeal hearing.

**Delegation Arrangements** - MPC confirmed appointments to its Personnel Committee and Working Groups which can be found https://www.meppershall.org/index.php/parish-council/councillors

**Finance** - MPC reviewed its assets register and proposed to extend the register to include photographs of all MPC Assets.

MPC received its internal audit report. Sally King from Auditing Solutions Limited reported: "No issues have been identified in relation to the verification of detail in the Statement of Accounts and AGAR this year [2020 – 2021]. On the basis of our detailed work during the course of the Council's systems of financial control and content of the detailed Statement of Accounts and that set out in the AGAR, we have signed off the Internal Audit Report of the AGAR assigning positive assurances in each relevant area." The Clerk was thanked for producing a "no issues" result to the audit for 2020-2021.

MPC approved its Annual Governance and Accounting Statements 2020-2021 for submission to the External Auditor, along with confirming the dates for the Exercise of Public Rights to Inspect MPC Accounts (18th May 2020 to 16th July 2020).

**Planning and Housing -** MPC considered planning applications relevant Meppershall as follows:

- i. CB/21/01409/FULL Polehanger Farm Alterations to existing buildings No Objections
- ii. CB/21/01410/LB Polehanger Farm Alterations to existing buildings and repairs to Grade 2 barns *No Objections*
- iii. CB/21/00887/LB Polehanger Farm Grade 2 listed building repairs No Objections
- iv. CB/21/01207/FULL Meppershall Airfield two 3-bedroomed semi-detached staff dwellings Objections raised include: 1) loss of best and versatile agricultural land; and 2) immediacy of need for staff dwellings on site at the Airfield.
- v. CB/21/01531/FULL 47 Orchard Close Erection of outbuilding and change of use of garden *No Objections*
- vi. CB/21/00785/FULL Ansell Village Stores Revised description of development Objections on grounds of noise and traffic issues previously submitted to CBC reaffirmed
- vii. CB/21/01596/FULL 40 Fildyke Road Front Porch, rear loft conversion and rear conservatory conversion *No Objections*

The Planning Inspectorate heard an appeal against planning permission being refused for 40 Shefford Road, by CBC on Tuesday 13 April 2021. The appeal decision, released on 7<sup>th</sup> May 2021, was to dismiss the appeal citing reasons of erosion of rural character of the site, urbanisation would be discordant with the existing pattern of the settlement and the identity of its countryside setting, conflicting with the Landscape Strategy of conserving and strengthening the distinctive pattern of hilltop settlements and unsettled hill slopes of the Upper Gravenhurst-Meppershall Clay Hills Landscape Character Area and urbanising impact that would erode the distinctive open rural character of the setting of the village. As CBC is close to delivering its Local Plan and our own Meppershall Neighbourhood Plan is close to

completion, this will go further to remove the ability of developers to claim the presumption of sustainable development when making future planning applications.

CB/21/00053/Full – 1 Shefford Road -The development of 5 new homes to the rear of the existing bungalow was granted by CBC, but with a total of 21 conditions attached to the development.

CB/TRE/21/00041 — Works to the oak tree located outside 84 Shefford Road. The proposed removal resulted in considerable local discussion and responses submitted to the Planning Team at CBC, with the vast majority raising objections to the proposal to remove the very substantial and highly visible tree from the local landscape in Meppershall. As a result of the conflicting information supplied by the applicant, the CBC felt it could not be clearly shown that the oak tree was the prime cause of damage to the nearby property and as such at present consent to fell the tree has been refused. Since 2014, Meppershall has seen upwards of 20+ hectares of best and versatile agricultural land developed in the village removing countless trees and many other aspects of the rural character of the village. MPC are delighted that the Planning Authority have on this occasion enforced the Tree Preservation Order and refused permission for the tree to be removed.

**Neighbourhood Plan** - The Clerk updated MPC on progress of the Neighbourhood Plan for Meppershall. The Steering Group hope to commenced Regulation 14 consultations with the community very soon. The Steering Group are still looking for volunteers to assist in the final stages of creating the Neighbourhood plan and anyone wishing to help should contact the Clerk clerk@meppershall.org.

**Highways and Transport** - MPC reversed its decision made at the last Council meeting to object to the request from the Department of Transport for the proposed stopping of the highway at land opposite 34 – 42 Shefford Road. The Clerk advised that upon investigation MPC had misunderstood the request. In short 'stopping up of the highway' means a section of highway being removed from Highways control and hence removing public access to it. The proposal is actually a request for the developers of land opposite 34-42 Shefford Road to take control of this section of land abutting the road for inclusion in their development (long section of hedgerow).

**Environment and Leisure** - The Clerk provided an update on the new grass cutting contractor. There had been a delay in starting cutting this year due to the unexpected appointment of the new contractor and teething issues were to be expected. What appeared to be unfinished grass-cutting works at the end of day 1 cutting were dealt with by the contractor on their return on day 2-3.

The Clerk provided an update on Centenary Field. Following many hours of discussions with Croudace Homes, the Clerk was pleased to report that a settlement

letter was being prepared on behalf of MPC and the Village Hall Trustees to finalise the handover of land from Croudace in the very near future. MPC hope to begin remedial works to bring Centenary Field and the pitches as soon as reasonably possible after the land is transferred to MPC and MVHT ownership once again.

The Clerk reported on discussion with residents whose properties abut the Fildyke Road end of Old Road Meadow. MPC will seek to enter into agreements with those residents whose properties are on the boundary with Old Road Meadow as necessary.

The Clerk reported on discussions with Village Hall Trustees on the future use of the changing rooms and their use in connection with the football pitch. MPC advised that at present they are unable to provide any specific requirements from the use of the football pitch in the future until its ownership has been fully transferred to MPC and Council have debated its potential uses going forward.

**Community Safety and Risk Management –** The Clerk, MPC Cllr Seaman, Mr Walker (MVHT) and Mr Cordes (MVHT) met with PCSO's Lee and Beddall and Ms Beard (CBC) They discussed issues of anti-social behaviour (vandalism, on 21st April 2021. potential drug dealing / taking etc.) in Meppershall and in particular near to the village hall area and green spaces. They discussed measures such as anti-climb paint to stop youths accessing the roofs of storage containers and the village hall roof, spikes to prevent access etc. Bedfordshire Police are aware of the youths in Shefford and that they may potentially be coming into Meppershall. Both the Police and CBC Community Safety Officers are and will patrol the areas around the Village Hall, Old Road Meadow and the Rights Of Way footpaths to Polehanger Farm. It was agreed that MPC would appeal to residents for their help (it is no good reporting issues on Facebook), they must be reported to the Police on 101, 999 or Crime Stoppers if wanting to remain anonymous. Incidents involving more than groups of 6 youths causing issues (or the potential to cause issues) should be reported to the Clerk. The CBC Community Safety team will speak to Youth Services and the Community Engagement Team to see if they can provide more assistance. Speeding, especially excessive speeding on Shefford Road was discussed and it was proposed that Beds Police carry out speed enforcement work on Shefford Road. Finally, Dog Fouling was discussed and the Clerk will provide CBC with list of hotspot areas so that they can be added to the dog patrol list.

The next meeting of Meppershall Parish Council will take place on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> June 2021 at Meppershall Village Hall at 7.45pm.

### What is a councillor?

Councillors are elected to represent an individual geographical ward or parish, in Meppershall it is the entire parish. They are generally elected by the public every four years, but there are Co-option spaces available on the Parish Council at the moment as Councillors Karslake, Austin and Thomason have given their resignations to the Parish Council.

### What do councillors do?

Councillors have three main components to their work:

- 1. Decision making Through meetings and attending committees with other elected members, councillors decide which activities to support, where money should be spent, what services should be delivered and what policies should be implemented.
- 2. Monitoring Councillors make sure that their decisions lead to efficient and effective services by keeping an eye on how well things are working.
- 3. Getting involved locally As local representatives, councillors have responsibilities towards their constituents and local organisations. These responsibilities and duties often depend on what the councillor wants to achieve and how much time is available, and may include:
- Going to meetings of local organisations such as the Beds Police Priority Setting Meetings
- Reviewing planning applications
- Participating in litter picks
- Taking up issues on behalf of members of the public

### How much time does it take up?

Quite often councillors say that their duties occupy them for about an hour a week. Obviously there are some councillors who spend more time than this - and some less, but in the main, being a parish councillor is an enjoyable way of contributing to village life, and helping to make it a better place to live and work.

As a councillor representing the parish you will help keep it a great place to live and work. You will be supported in your role and will be expected to undertake training. You should be comfortable working electronically. You should have a positive outlook and a can-do attitude and be willing to work as part of a team.





### Do You Believe in the Dog Poo Fairy?



### What to do with dog poop bags?

"Owners should keep their dog waste bags with them until they can find a dog waste bin or regular litter bin, or should take it home with them to dispose of it properly."



# So why do some Meppershall dogwalkers hurl or hang poo bags on trees and hedges in our in and around the village or worse still not pick it up at all, and can they be fined?

The short answer is, yes. As a dog owner you're expected to poop and scoop and discard in your own black bin or in dog waste bins provided by the council or local landowner. Anybody spotted hanging their dog mess from trees is risking a fine, even though the mess is bagged. It's classed as littering, as you're knowingly discarding bagged waste. And poo left lying around in a bag hangs around for even longer than poo that hasn't been bagged. As for those who don't pick up your dog poo at all, this is also an offence. And please don't think that dog mess only needs to be picked up if it's on a footpath. All dog poo should be picked up!

### What can I do if I see someone doing it?

People living near places where hurling or hanging bagged dog poo is a major problem should let their council know its happening, so officers can monitor and enforce the problem. The same goes for dog mess not picked up.

### Why do people do it?

There's no real answer to this. It could be passive aggressiveness, laziness or people thinking they are just being helpful by hanging it on a tree or leaving it on the ground. Other people think that dog waste bins are not emptied enough so there is no alternative. Worse still some think that because their dog has pooped somewhere adjacent to a footpath or near a bush it's out of the way and who cares

anyway. But let's face it, no-one who does it is likely to publicly admit it, let alone tell us why they are doing it.

### What can be done about it?

Dog fouling is a problem that councils actually take pretty seriously but sadly it is one that can be fairly difficult to actually stop. The Parish Council has discussed the matter with Central Bedfordshire Council so we hope to see the Dog Warden in the village and fining people who aren't pooping and scooping soon!

### How can dog owners make sure they set a good example?

A spokeswoman for the Kennel Club said: "Dog owners should always clean up after their dogs and dispose of the waste appropriately, and the vast majority do. However, a small minority who do not can give all dog owners a bad name.

A lack of bins in an area, particularly public footpaths through the countryside and woodland areas, can be frustrating but is not an excuse to hang dog waste bags in trees, leave them on the ground or not pick up as some people seem to do.

# What You Need to Know About the COVID-19 Vaccination



The Covid-19 vaccination programme is the largest in the history of the NHS. The vaccine is being offered to more and more people in our area every week.

Vaccines can reduce or even eliminate some diseases, if enough people are vaccinated.

Since vaccines were introduced, diseases like smallpox and polio that used to kill or disable millions of people are gone from the UK.

### How do vaccines work?

Vaccines teach your immune system how to protect you from diseases. It's much safer for your immune system to learn this through vaccination than by catching the diseases and attempting to fight them.

### Can I catch Covid-19 from the vaccine?

No. You cannot catch Covid-19 from taking the vaccine but having the vaccine could stop you from becoming seriously ill if you catch the infection.

### Should I be concerned about the speed the vaccine was made available?

The speed in which the vaccines have been developed does not mean that they are unsafe. The technology used to develop the vaccine is not new. It's been tried and tested for decades. It is with this technology and massive global investment to develop a Covid-19 vaccine that has allowed it to be available so quickly.

Any coronavirus vaccine that is approved must go through lots of clinical trials and safety checks, like all other licensed medicines, before it is approved. The Covid-19 vaccines used in the UK have been declared as effective by the UK's independent Medicines and Healthcare Products Regulator (MHRA) after extensive trials.

### When will I be able to get vaccinated?

The NHS will announce when different age groups can book their vaccination, you can check who is eligible at any time and book your appointment online at <a href="https://www.nhs.uk/covid-vaccination">www.nhs.uk/covid-vaccination</a>. You can also book appointments by calling 119.

You may also receive an invitation to book your vaccination from your GP and you can book an appointment directly with them.

### No Room for Complacency – Use Your Free COVID Tests at Home

The Leader of Central Bedfordshire Council, Councillor Richard Wenham, recently urged everyone in our region to take extra care as the number of COVID-19 cases has continued to rise. His message is that we must not drop our guard, even though lockdown is being eased. "Hands, face, space" remain essential and meeting other people outside is the safest option. If meeting others indoors, use plenty of ventilation (open windows etc) and don't spend too long inside with others.

Councillor Wenham informed local residents that cases of COVID-19 are increasing in the area including the new Variant of Concern that was first detected in India.

Across the UK, this variant has been doubling on a weekly basis including a significant number of new cases locally in Bedford. Health Secretary Matt Hancock recently said that up to three quarters of new cases are likely to be the Indian Variant. Every week, a handful of new COVID infections cases continue to be diagnosed in our local area (Shefford, Shillington, Meppershall, Stondon, Clifton)

Councillor Wenham said: "While infection levels in Central Bedfordshire are not at the same level as Bedford or other areas of the country there is absolutely no room for complacency. Evidence suggests that this variant might be more transmissible than previous variants, so I am urging everyone to take extra care now to control the spread and prevent a serious outbreak here in Central Bedfordshire."

He continued: "As well as being more transmissible, it looks like the variant is mostly affecting people under 40 years of age, including school children so this really does need everyone to be careful.

"There is no evidence that the new variant is resistant to the vaccine, so it's even more important that you take up the offer of vaccination when it is available to you."

He also encouraged everyone to get tested before going somewhere where we will come into contact with others – for example doing a rapid test if you are going to the pub, a friend's house, a restaurant or the gym.

"Rapid tests are easy to do yourself and you can get them from our mobile testing sites, from local pharmacies or order them online to be delivered to you. They are free and easy to do, and you get a result in 30 minutes" he said.



### **Dividing your finances on divorce**

Currently, however, the heightened stress and reduced financial circumstances caused by the pandemic may make coming to an agreement more difficult. If a couple is unable to agree, they may still be able to settle out of court by hiring a trained mediator or collaborative lawyer. If not, they may have to ask a court to decide. Talk it through. ### **Economic Review Update**

The UK economy returned to growth in February and survey evidence suggests a strong recovery is imminent, as lockdown restrictions ease and the vaccine rollout continues at pace. Data published by the Office for National Statistics (ONS) showed the economy grew by 0.4% in February, as businesses prepared for the lifting of the third national lockdown. Commenting on the figures, an ONS spokesperson said, "The economy showed some improvement in February after the large falls seen at the start of the year, but remains around 8% below its pre-pandemic level." While February's growth rate was below market expectations and the first quarter as a whole still looks on course for a modest contraction, the data does point to an improving situation. Survey evidence suggests economic activity has recovered further in recent months. April's IHS Markit/CIPS flash composite Purchasing Managers' Index, for instance, rose to 60.0 in April, up from 56.4 in March. This was the highest reading since November 2013 and suggests the economy is poised for a rapid recovery. As a result of the improving outlook, a number of organisations have recently upgraded their UK economic forecasts. The EY ITEM Club's new projections, for example, predict growth of 6.8% in 2021, a significant increase from its previous figure of 5.0%. The group's Chief Economic Adviser, Dr Howard Archer, said the forecast implies the economy will "emerge from the pandemic with much less longterm 'scarring' than was originally envisaged and looks set for a strong recovery over the rest of the year and beyond." Revised forecasts released by Goldman Sachs suggest the UK will now see faster growth than the US this year. In a note to clients, the bank said it expects the UK economy to expand by a "striking" 7.8% in 2021, compared to US growth of 7.2%

Labour market 'broadly stable': ONS has described the jobs market as 'broadly stable in recent months,' after its latest set of statistics revealed a small decline in the number of employees on company payrolls, alongside a dip in the rate of unemployment. According to the latest data, 56,000 fewer people were in payrolled employment in March than in February, the first monthly decline in this measure of employment in four months. Over the year to March, a total of 813,000 payroll jobs were lost across the UK, with younger age groups bearing the brunt of these cuts.

The country's latest unemployment rate, however, which covers the December to February period, unexpectedly fell for the second month in a row. The overall rate dipped to 4.9% across the three months to February, down from 5.0% in the previous three-month period. Government support measures have clearly been a key factor behind the suppressed rate of unemployment, with around five million people still employed but on furlough. In addition, ONS linked the recent fall to a large volume of men exiting the jobs market, with the inactivity rate rising by 0.2 percentage points in the latest three-month period. Commenting on the data, ONS Director of Economic Statistics Darren Morgan, said the labour market "remains subdued" although he also stressed there were positive signs particularly with respect to the easing of lockdown restrictions. Mr Morgan said, "With the prospect of businesses reopening, there was a marked rise in job vacancies in March, especially in sectors such as hospitality." Indeed, experimental data being trialled by ONS reported a 16% rise in vacancies during March, while online job advert estimates also point to further strengthening in the first two weeks of April. This echoes KPMG and REC research findings, which highlighted a recent significant improvement in recruitment activity.





## Bedford Model Engineering Society Summerfield Miniature Railway – 2021 Events

We Are Open Again!

#### With Covid-19 Secure Running at least until June 26th.

Bedford Model Engineering Society is once again able to open its railway to the public - but for the time being we will have to operate in the same way as we did during 2020 (see the service description that follows). We hope to resume "normal" public running towards the end of June but that will depend upon the further relaxation or removal of the Covid restrictions.

With the current concerns regarding the "Indian Variant", particularly as it affects the Bedford area, and the subsequent uncertainty that "Step 4" will happen on June 21st, we have decided to add Sunday June 27th to the booking calendar. By so doing we should still be able to open for those who have booked should Step 4 not happen. If in the end, Covid restrictions are removed before the 27th we can still decide to revert to pre-Covid operating when booking was not required.

## "Covid" regulated service - there is a lot to tell you here, but please read through to the end.

Unfortunately, we are not still going to be able to operate <u>all</u> of our railways with the Covid regulations as they currently are. So, we will continue as last year with the "new" ride combining the Summerfields Line (the 'main line') from Haynes End with the Springfield Line at Hammer Hill. This gives a journey time nearly twice that of the old main line run. The trains will not be stopping at Hammer Hill.

Trains will have only one carriage and the passengers on each train must all be from the same household or "Bubble". .

Our Buffet will open as a take-away service with tea, coffee, soft drinks and packaged snack items. Our picnic tables will be available outside - suitably distanced!

**Toilets** - as you may know the toilets do not belong to Bedford MES but are provided as a communal facility by our landlord for those on the Summerfields Barns site. Although they are not our responsibility, we will endeavour to check them on a regular basis. We will be providing hand sanitiser in a dispenser just outside the toilet block.

In common with other visitor attractions we have had to move to booking in advance in order to better manage passenger numbers on our site, and **all** payments will have to be made using contactless card.

We use your details to process your booking but we are also required to take contact details of visitors for Track and Trace purposes. No data will be retained beyond one month after your visit and will not be used for purposes other than those stated.

Therefore, we are asking that everybody who wants to ride our trains, first makes a booking online. Payment will still be taken at our Ticket Office but, again as other venues, **only** by contactless card.

Our trains will carry a maximum of six passengers with a maximum of four adults. Please do not attempt to book more than this on one train.

A round trip ticket will cost £4 **per person**. Children under the age of two still travel free. We hope that you will understand that the price increase this year was unavoidable. We have not increased prices for several years, and it was set to happen last year, but we deferred that increase. However, with our receipts last year only around 50% of the previous year a price rise this year was necessary if the railway was to survive for you to enjoy.

So, please pick a time and date on the booking form at the bottom of this page, complete with your details and submit. You will receive a confirmation email by return.

Please ensure that you bring the confirmation email with you on the day as it is your E-ticket.

In the event that you have to CANCEL we would **really** like you to let us know (before your day of travel if at all possible, please), by clicking the REPLY button to the confirmation email and dropping us a one-liner.

Since we started this new way of working we have always been fully booked. However we have found that between 15% and 20% of the folk who have booked simply do not bother to show up, thus denying others the chance for a ride (and us some much needed funds).

We would rather not take payment at the time of booking but what we will do is reserve the right to offer the slot to anyone wanting another ride if you are not checked in at the car park entrance a minimum of TEN minutes <u>before</u> your train departure time. Please, please make sure that you are checked in with our car park staff at least ten minutes before your train is due to depart – if you are later than that, we will not be able to guarantee your ride.

And lastly, it is a *railway* so, just like the "big" trains, departure times may slip a bit from your booked time due to operational circumstances. We will do our very best to be on schedule, but please be patient with us if we should be running late!

**Thank You** for your understanding and for supporting our railway - as always, we are looking forward to seeing you.
